46 Gwinnett students make 2012 National Merit list

More than 40 Gwinnett County Public Schools (GCPS) students recently learned that they're on their way to earning some of the nation's most prestigious scholarships having been named a 2012 National Merit Scholarship Program Semifinalist. The National Merit Scholarship Corporation recently announced the names of the 46 GCPS high school seniors presented with the honor. The group of students represent 12 Gwinnett high schools including **Brookwood High; Central Gwinnett High; Collins Hill High; Duluth High; Grayson High; Gwinnett School of Mathematics, Science, and Technology; Mill Creek High; Mountain View High; Norcross High; North Gwinnett High; Parkview High; and Peachtree Ridge High**. They're part of approximately 16,000 semifinalists from across the nation who will now compete for the official National Merit Scholar title and the thousands of dollars in scholarships that are annually awarded to graduating seniors along with the honor.

These 46 Gwinnett students, part of the class 2012, were chosen for this competitive process based on their college entrance exam scores. They are competing with other semifinalists from throughout the nation for some 8,300 National Merit scholarships, worth more than \$34 million. The scholarships will be awarded next spring.

These academically talented students will now compete to become finalists. That level is determined by looking at the student's academic record throughout high school, an endorsement/recommendation by the school principal, and SAT scores that confirm the student's earlier qualifying test performance. The semifinalist must submit a detailed scholarship application, which includes a self-descriptive essay and information about the semifinalist's participation and leadership in school and community activities.

More than 1.5 million students in over 22,000 high schools entered the competition last school year as juniors by taking the 2010 Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test, which served as the initial screening for program entrants. The semifinalists named in the 2012 National Merit Scholarship Program are the highest scoring entrants in each state.

The students will compete for three types of National Merit Scholarships to be awarded in the spring of 2012.
